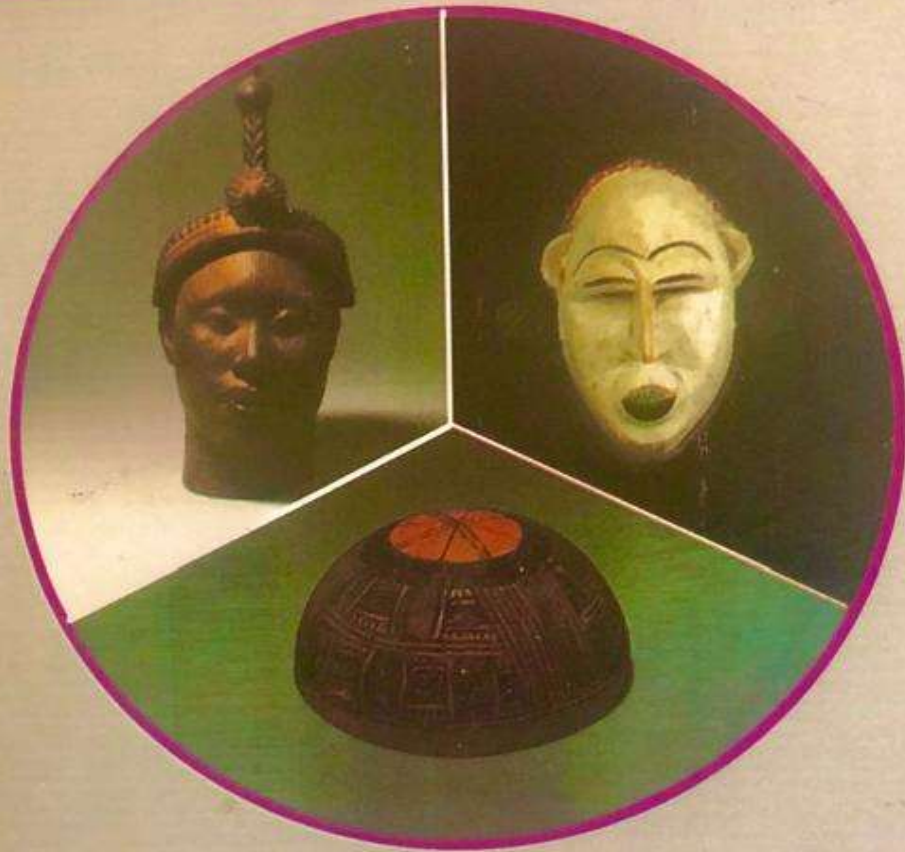

The cover page must contain the Title, Name of author(s), Institution of the author(s), Email address, and Phone number of the author(s). The references must follow APA or MLA citation style and be listed alphabetically.
